

By-Laws

Article I

President

Section 1. The president, or in his absence, the Vice-President shall preside at all meetings of the association and at meetings of the Executive Committee.

Section 2. The president shall have no right to vote except any questions where the votes are equally divided.

Article II

Vice-President

The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in the event of the latter's absence or inability to act.

Article III

Secretary-Treasurer

Section 1. The Secretary shall keep the records of the proceedings of the association, and of the Executive Committee and shall keep an account of all business that he has transacted for the association. He shall make a complete report to the association at the Annual Business meeting.

Section 2. He shall have charge of necessary printing and other publications ordered by the Association.

Section 3. He shall receive and have charge of all fees and dues and shall pay the current expenses by check, from money so received when approval has been given by the Executive Committee.

Section 4. At all other times than at the meeting he shall serve as the Executive Officer of the association.

Section 5. He shall receive all applications for membership and shall present them to the Executive Committee. He shall notify each candidate each candidate a copy of the receipt of his application, and shall send each candidate a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws

Section 6. The secretary may assign matches.

Article IV

Sergeant-at Arms

Section 1. The Sergeant-at-Arms shall preserve order at all meetings and affairs of the association, and admit only members in good standing at the meetings. He shall also admit guest to the meetings.

Section 2. He shall serve as a member of the Executive Committee.

Article V

Rules Interpreter

Section 1. The Rules Interpreter will serve as a liaison between the State Rules Interpreter and the members of the association.

Section 2. He shall clarify questions and situations related to Wrestling officiating in an attempt to produce consistency and uniformity of rule interpretations amongst all members of the association.

Section 3. He shall answer all questions pertaining to the rules in accordance with the interpretations adopted by the O.H.S.A.A.

Section 4. He shall avail himself to the coaches served by this association for any rule interpretation.

Article VI

Regulations

Section 1. No member of this association will officiate in any High School match without obtaining appropriate State registration.

Section 2. Every official will adhere to the adopted uniforms.
